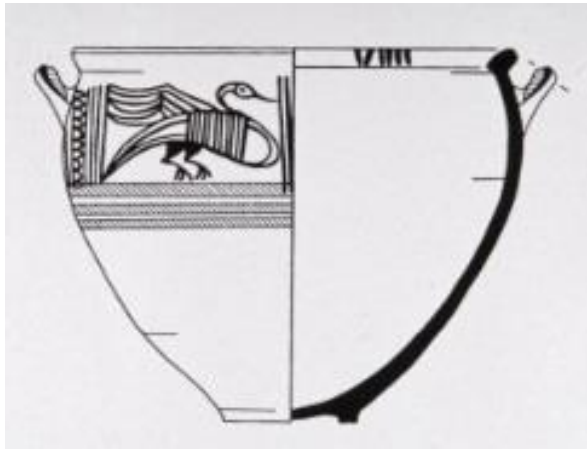


Fig. 10. A Bird, as painted on an Amorite and a Philistine Vase respectively.

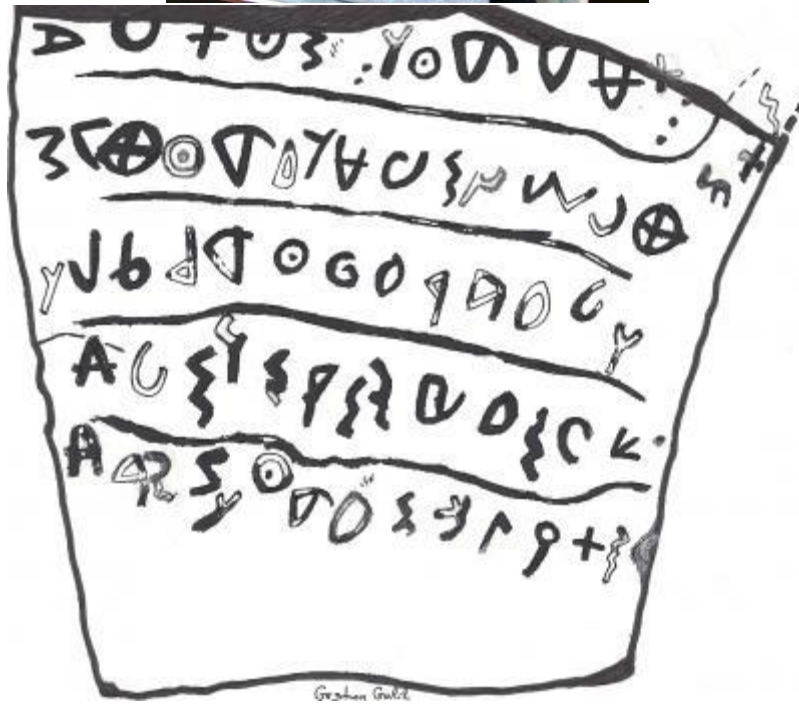

Trapezoid Israelite Pottery ⁶



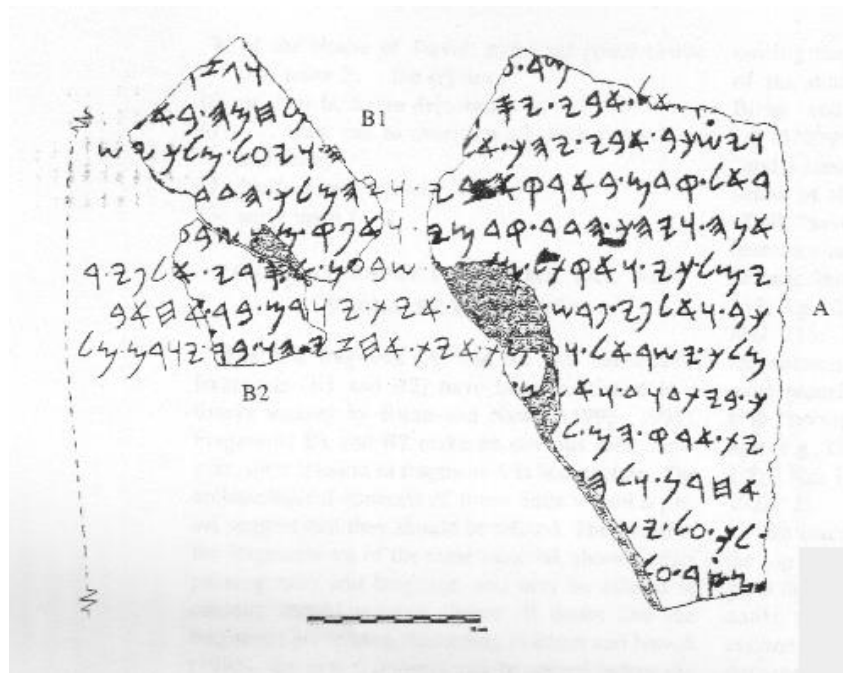
More information: English translation of the deciphered text:

- 2' Judge the sla[ve] and the wid[ow] / Judge the orph[an]
- 3' [and] the stranger. [Pl]ead for the infant / plead for the po[or and]
- 4' the widow. Rehabilitate [the poor] at the hands of the king.
- 5' Protect the po[or and] the slave / [supp]ort the stranger.
